To enhance the physical, emotional, and spiritual health of all those who live, work and play in Cumberland County now and for generations to come.



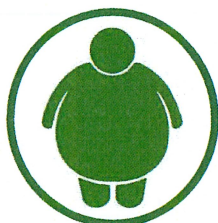

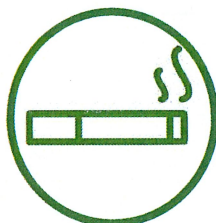
